### online learning - constructions

<u>The online **learning** platform</u>, <u>which offers courses</u> from more than 50 universities, <u>was set up in</u> 2013 by the Open University, as a UK provider for so-called Moocs (massive, open, online courses).

Neil Morris, <u>director of digital **learning** at the University of Leeds</u>, said this was a step towards a more "pick and mix" style of higher education, in which students could have a much more customised approach to learning.

### credits/degree – constructions

<u>It will allow students to take</u> a University of Leeds <u>online course</u> in Environmental Challenges and, if they pass an exam, to gain **credits** towards a geography **degree** at Leeds.

An online university is offering 500 refugees from Syria's civil war free places on its degree courses

The university <u>offers fully accredited four-year **degrees**</u>, completely taught online, with students scattered across 180 countries

They have tens of millions of students, but they usually <u>offer only **short units**</u> rather than <u>**full**</u> <u>**degrees**</u>.

It's about <u>providing qualifications</u> to improve employability for students who are in difficult circumstances.

As such, the university <u>has focused on a small range of **subject areas**</u>, such as computing, health and business

The courses are built on 40 separate units, with each usually costing \$100 (£77) to take an invigilated exam - making a full degree \$4,000 (£3,100)

"<u>With</u> better search tools and <u>an increase in the availability of</u> <u>digital content</u>, <u>finding information</u> <u>has become easier</u>," says Krisellen Maloney, dean of libraries at UTSA.

<u>Students at UTSA have embraced their</u> <u>all-digital library</u>, and even created a YouTube video about the experience.

But <u>academic publishers have been slow to embrace</u> <u>digital models</u> <u>of publishing</u>, and for good reason.

Digital books can also be shared and copied.

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#### electronic – constructions

In 2000, Kansas State University opened an electronic library, but kept some reference books.

"Some publishers have been slow to make all of their information available in electronic format."

<u>The sleek glass library</u> seats 80 people and <u>holds 425,000</u> <u>e-books</u> and 18,000 <u>e-journal</u> <u>subscriptions</u>.

And <u>the library plans to offer</u> pre-loaded collections of texts on iPads and <u>e-readers</u> for students to check out and take home.

### tuition fee – constructions

<u>The problem for the academic publishers is, of course, that they cannot charge the same **tuition fees** for e-books as for physical books.</u>

It will mean reducing the time and cost of **tuition fees** for a full degree.

Students wanting to take an exam and gain credits this way will have to pay £545, but it will lead to a discount of £750 on **tuition fees** for a full degree.

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## philanthropy in education-constructions

Students are taught for 20 hours per week in online classes of about 20 to 30 students, with the instruction and support and homework assignments <u>provided by a small army of volunteer academics</u> and retired university staff, who receive only a token payment

The aim is to make the university self-sustaining, but it's <u>supported by some big **donors**</u>, including the Gates Foundation, Hewlett Packard and Google.

## residential/in-person – constructions

Prof Morris said that it could lead to <u>students putting together their own degree courses</u>, <u>studying</u> <u>different units from different universities and mixing online learning with **residential courses**.</u>

<u>The traditional three-year</u>, **residential** university **system** would not disappear, he said, but for many people that remained "too conventional, too inflexible, too locked down".
